



- Established Reception Center at Ranch View Elementary (Naperville)
 - Initial Client Casework, Respite Care, Basic Feeding
- Engaged Unified Command Center with a Red Cross Liaison
- Engaged Joint Information Center with a Red Cross PIO
 - Provided Spokesperson for Press Conferences and Media Interviews



Monday (Day 1) - Afternoon


- Established Base Camp at Jefferson Junior High School (Woodridge)
 - Red Cross Area Command
 - Logistics and Operations
 - Mass Care Shelter Site for 20 Clients
 - Reassigned Fleet Vehicles from Rockford, Peoria, and Springfield
- Began Preliminary Disaster Assessment (PDA) in the Field
















Tuesday June 22, 2021



Tuesday (Day 2)

- Shifted Focus to Woodridge
- Expanded Red Cross Workforce to 60
 - Logistics, Shelter, Mass Care Feeding, Disaster Assessment
- Began Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES) in the Field
- Began Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field
- Began Mass Care Feeding in the Field










Wednesday June 23, 2021



Wednesday (Day 3)

- Engaged the NE Illinois Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD)
- Began Preparations for Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) for Weekend
 - Red Cross Workforce Expands to 100
 - Includes Healthcare and Mental Health Services
- Continued Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES) in the Field
- Continued Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field
 - Coordinated with Public Works to Reconcile DDA
- Continued Mass Care Feeding in the Field










Thursday June 24, 2021




Thursday (Day 4)

- Closed Mass Care Shelter at Jefferson Junior High School
- Shifted Workforce to Logistics Need for MARC
 - Rented Tents, Forklifts, Pallet Jacks, and Tarps
 - Logistics Teams Bring Equipment and Material from Romeoville
 - Disaster Service Technology Built Field Intranet and Radio Network
 - Coordinated with Woodridge PD for Onsite Security and Traffic Detail
 - Coordinated with Woodridge School District for Facility Needs
- Continued Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES) in the Field
- Continued Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field
- Continued Mass Care Feeding in the Field









Friday June 25, 2021



Friday (Day 5)

- Consolidated All Red Cross Operations at Jefferson Junior High School
 - Closed Reception Center at Ranch View Elementary School
- Continued Preparations for MARC
 - Red Cross Trailer Arrives from St. Louis with MARC Supplies
 - Completed Fire Marshall Walk-Through with Lisle-Woodridge FPD
 - Finalize Emergency Medical Service Plan with Lisle-Woodridge FPD
 - Finalize Traffic Pattern, Security, and Electronic Message Signs with Woodridge PD
- Continued Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES) in the Field
- Continued Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field
- Continued Mass Care Feeding in the Field












Saturday June 26, 2021

 - Open to Public at 0900
 - Closed about 1800
 - Served 650 Families
- Paused Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES) in the Field
- Continued Mass Care Feeding in the Field
- Continued Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field










Sunday June 27, 2021




Sunday (Day 7)

- Second Day of MARC
 - Open to Public at 0900
 - Closed about 1300
 - Served 350 Families
- Continued Mass Care Feeding in the Field
- Continued Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field
- Logistics Team Begins Teardown













Monday June 28, 2021



Monday (Day 8)

- Red Cross Stands Down at Jefferson Junior High School
- Resumed Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES) in the Field
- Continued Mass Care Feeding in the Field
- Continued Detailed Disaster Assessment (DDA) in the Field





Lessons Learned

- Red Cross Hasn't Educated Municipal Government on Our Mission
- Liaison with Public Works is Vital
- Disaster Assessment is Contextual
- Early Access to the Disaster Area is Vital
 - We cannot begin casework until PDA is underway
