

With this real world training, public service stakeholders can extend their knowledge and skills for protecting their communities and critical infrastructure from potential or actual threats.

During this course, participants work together in multidisciplinary teams to apply the course information with their professional experience in a variety of hands-on, small group activities, and disaster scenarios.

This course brings together planning and management officials who are expected to identify and mitigate hazards, and who plan and manage disaster response and recovery efforts or have emergency management roles within their jurisdictions.

*NOTE: This is one of four courses Aurora is offering in the Infrastructure Disaster Management Certificate Program. All four courses will be held in Aurora between 2020 and 2021.
