

**MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING**

**Intergovernmental Agreement  
State of Illinois  
Illinois Emergency Management Agency**

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the Illinois Coroners and Medical Examiners Association (ICMEA) enter into and execute this Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

A. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCD 220/1 et seq., and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/1 et seq., and is subject to all applicable only to the ICMEA assets. All terminology in this Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

B. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide disaster response assistance to units of local government during declared disasters when local and regional resources are insufficient to meet the disaster response needs of the requesting unit of local government, and to provide for disaster training exercises to maximize the effectiveness of responses to disaster related requests for assistance.

C. PERFORMANCE PERIOD

This Agreement shall remain in effect from September 5, 2005 until August 1, 2009 unless renewed or terminated earlier pursuant to Section I of this Agreement.

D. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING OR PROVIDING ASSISTANCE  
DURING A DECLARED DISASTER

When a disaster is declared to have occurred within the jurisdiction of a local governmental unit by the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the resources available through local or regional units are insufficient to adequately respond to the disaster such that the local resources are being utilized to the fullest possible extent, the affected local governmental unit may request assistance from IEMA by contacting the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). All IEMA approved requests for assistance to or from ICMEA shall be coordinated within the SEOC through the Illinois State Police (ISP). The SEOC may request assistance from the ICMEA. The ICMEA shall dispatch to the affected area any and all personnel and equipment which are available from the ICMEA.

Personnel and equipment so dispatched shall report to the State Incident Commander at the Unified Area Command Post (UACP), who shall then assign personnel and equipment to the Local Incident Commander in support of local operations. Upon completion of the disaster response operation, the dispatched personnel and equipment shall be subject to further reassignment in support of the operation at the discretion of the State Incident Commander. The State Incident Commander may either re-assign the personnel and equipment for additional missions, or provide for the timely release of the personnel and equipment to the sending local governmental units.

#### E. PROCEDURE FOR DISASTER TRAINING EXERCISES

During any training exercises, the training participants, as required to achieve the objectives of the training exercise, shall follow the procedure set forth in paragraph D, above. All training exercises will be subject to the mutual agreement and availability of units to participate.

#### F. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT AND INJURIES TO PERSONNEL

Equipment dispatched pursuant to this Agreement shall become property of the State of Illinois while it is being used pursuant to this Agreement. Personnel dispatched pursuant to this agreement shall be members of Mobile Support Teams, as provided in Section 8 of the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/8) during their service pursuant to this Agreement. Liability for damages to equipment and/or injuries to personnel shall be determined pursuant to relevant provisions of the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/1 eq seq.) and all other applicable statutes.

#### G. REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COST OF RESPONSE

Responding agencies acting pursuant to this Agreement shall be reimbursed for all eligible cost incurred for responses approved by IEMA pursuant to this Agreement and in accordance with the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/1 et seq.) and other applicable statutes. Eligible costs are those incurred on or after the date of the disaster event that is subject of a State disaster declaration. Except for costs covered under Section F of this Agreement, responding agencies may be reimbursed, in whole or in part, for those costs incurred prior to receiving IEMA's approval. Such determination shall be at the sole discretion of IEMA in accordance with statutory authority.

#### H. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Director of IEMA may, at his or her discretion, appoint an Advisory Committee to assist in the implementation and refinement of this Agreement. The member of such committee shall include a minimum of one (1) ICMEA representative.

I. AMENDMENTS, RENEWAL, AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be renewed for an additional specific term upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 90 days written notice, as provided in Section J, following.





**MOBILE SUPPORT TEAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
THE ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY AND  
THE ILLINOIS EMERGENCY SERVICES MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION**

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency ("IEMA") and the Illinois Emergency Services Management Association ("IESMA") enter into and execute this Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

A. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act ("Act"), 20 ILCS 3305/5, and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. All terminology in the Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Act and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

B. TERMINATION OF PRIOR AGREEMENT

The prior agreement entitled "Memorandum of Understanding" between IEMA and IESMA dated July 17, 2004, is terminated.

C. MST DESIGNATION/LEADER/PURPOSE

Pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Director of IEMA ("Director") hereby creates an IESMA-sponsored Mobile Support Team ("MST") to aid and to reinforce IEMA and emergency services and disaster agencies in areas stricken by disaster. The team shall be comprised of members of the Emergency Management Assistance Team ("EMAT"). The Leader of the EMAT MST ("Leader") is hereby designated on a rotating basis as the current President of IESMA. The Leader is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, training, and operation of the EMAT MST under the direction and control of the Director. The purpose of the team is to supplement personnel in emergency operations centers at the State and local levels.

D. TERM

This Agreement shall remain in effect from the execution date until terminated in accordance with paragraph K herein.

E. PREREQUISITES FOR TEAM ADMISSION

The following are prerequisites for MST membership for any EMAT member:

1. Submission of a written application.
2. Completion of the following training:

- NIMS and ICS Courses, and IEMA Professional Development Series as outlined in the IEMA Operations Training and Exercise SOG.
3. Minimum of 3 years' experience in emergency management.
  4. Submission of documentation indicating successful passage of criminal background check within 6 months of application.
  5. Submission of a written oath that is in accordance with section 20 of the Act.

All documentation for EMAT MST admission shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Operations Bureau Chief of IEMA ("Ops Chief"). Admission to the MST is effectuated only upon written notice by the Ops Chief of the approval of the additional member.

#### F. CONTINUING ANNUAL TRAINING and EXERCISE PARTICIPATION

In addition to the prerequisite training, all EMAT MST personnel must meet the following training and exercise requirements on an annual basis:

1. Completion of 24 hours of emergency management professional development training that is approved by the Leader.
2. Participation in three exercises, which may include seminars, workshops, tabletops, games, drills, and functional exercises. Real-world events can count toward this requirement.

In addition, any prerequisite classes required by paragraph E herein that are subsequently updated by FEMA must be retaken by (1) the end of the calendar year following the year of the class revision or (2) the end of the calendar year following the year of team member admission, whichever is later.

Proof of all such training and exercise completion shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Ops Chief. For real-world events or non-IEMA sponsored exercises, the after-action report and an explanation of the team member's involvement in the exercise should be submitted as proof of participation. The failure of a team member to complete the annual training and exercise requirements may result in removal from the EMAT MST at the sole discretion of IEMA.

#### G. TEAM ROSTER

The Leader shall compile an up-to-date team roster on an ongoing basis reflecting the current MST membership. The Leader shall submit a copy of the team roster to the Ops Chief no less than semi-annually and criminal background checks annually of all team members.

#### H. DEPLOYMENT

To fall within the scope of this Agreement, the EMAT MST must be deployed by the Director or the Ops Chief. The Director or Ops Chief will specify to IESMA

how many EMAT MST team members are needed for deployment. The Leader or his designee shall then be responsible for identifying available team members and providing the names to the Director or Ops Chief for specific assignment. Only team members who are available for a minimum of five consecutive days are eligible for deployment, unless specified otherwise by the Director or Ops Chief.

Personnel and equipment dispatched herein are under the purview of the State until the end of deployment. EMAT MST personnel who self-deploy or deploy in response to a request for assistance from any other person or entity are not acting under the purview of the State and thus are not entitled to the liability protections of paragraph I or reimbursement pursuant to paragraph J herein.

I. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT AND INJURIES TO PERSONNEL.

Liability for damages to equipment and injuries to personnel dispatched to a disaster pursuant to this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with section 8 of the Act and all other applicable statutes. In addition to other legal requirements, in order for IEMA to assume liability for injuries to personnel engaged in regularly scheduled training or exercises, such training must be approved in writing by the Ops Chief before participation.

J. REIMBURSEMENT

Reimbursement for EMAT's eligible costs incurred subsequent to deployment pursuant to paragraph H will be made in accordance with IEMA's then-current Reimbursement Policy.

K. AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended in writing upon consent of both parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 30 days' written notice served in accordance with paragraph L herein.



The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System (ILEAS) enter into and execute this Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide disaster response assistance to units of local government during declared disasters when local and regional resources are insufficient to meet the disaster response needs of the requesting unit of local government, and to provide for disaster training exercises to maximize the effectiveness of responses to disaster related requests for assistance.

The State Incident Commander may either re-assign the personnel and equipment for additional missions, or provide for the timely release of the personnel and equipment to the sending local governmental units.





**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
STATE OF ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

ILLINOIS TELECOMMUNICATOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE TASKFORCE**

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the Illinois Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (IL-TERT), an Intergovernmental Cooperative, enter into and execute this Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

**A. AUTHORITY**

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq., and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. This agreement is applicable only to the IL-TERT personnel and assets. All terminology in this Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

**B. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide disaster response assistance to a unit of local government during declared disasters when local and regional resources are insufficient to meet the disaster response needs of the requesting unit of local government, and to provide for disaster training exercises to maximize the effectiveness of responses to disaster related requests for assistance. Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) requests as approved by IEMA are included as part of this agreement's purpose.

**C. PERFORMANCE PERIOD**

This Agreement shall remain in effect terminated pursuant to Section I of this Agreement.

**D. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING OR PROVIDING ASSISTANCE DURING A DECLARED DISASTER**

When a disaster is declared to have occurred within the jurisdiction of a local governmental unit by the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the resources available through local or regional units are insufficient to adequately respond to the disaster such that the local resources are being utilized to the fullest possible extent, the affected local governmental unit may request assistance from IEMA by contacting the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). All IEMA approved requests for assistance to or from IL-TERT shall be coordinated within the SEOC through the Illinois State Police. The SEOC may request assistance from IL-TERT.

Upon receipt of a request for assistance from the SEOC, IL-TERT shall dispatch to the affected area any and all personnel and equipment which is available from the IL-TERT membership.

Personnel and equipment so dispatched shall report to the State Incident Commander at the Unified Area Command Post (UACP), who shall then assign the personnel and equipment to the Local Incident Commander in support of local operations.

Upon completion of the disaster response operation, the dispatched personnel and equipment shall be subject to further re-assignment in support of the operation at the discretion of the State Incident Commander. The State Incident Commander may either re-assign the personnel and equipment for additional missions, or provide for the timely release of the personnel and equipment to the sending local governmental units.

**MOBILE SUPPORT TEAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
THE ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY AND  
THE ILLINOIS MEDICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM TO  
DESIGNATE THE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM**

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency ("IEMA") and the Illinois Medical Emergency Response Team ("IMERT") enter into and execute this Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

A. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act ("Act"), 20 ILCS 3305/5, and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. All terminology in the Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Act and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

B. MST DESIGNATION/LEADER/PURPOSE

Pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Director of IEMA ("Director") hereby creates an IMERT-sponsored Mobile Support Team ("MST") to aid and to reinforce IEMA and emergency services and disaster agencies in areas stricken by disaster. The team shall be comprised of members of the Incident Management Team ("IMT") sponsored by IMERT. The Leader of the IMT MST ("Leader") is hereby designated as the senior IMT Co-Chair. The Leader is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, training, and operation of the IMT MST under the direction and control of the Director. The purpose of the team is to supplement personnel in incident command system positions at the State and local levels.

C. TERM

This Agreement shall remain in effect from the execution date until terminated in accordance with paragraph K herein.

D. PREREQUISITES FOR TEAM ADMISSION

The following are prerequisites for MST membership for any IMT member:

1. Submission of a written application.
2. ICS 100, 200, 300 and 400 (Command and General Staff for Local IMTs may be substituted for ICS 300 and 400).
3. USFA Type 3 IMT (O305) offering, customized simulation (50-hour on site); or S-420.
4. ICS position-specific professional development offered through the Emergency Management Institute.
5. Completion of field training.



6. Minimum of 5 years' experience in public safety.
7. Authorized by employing agency or jurisdiction.
8. Submission of documentation indicating successful passage of criminal background check within 6 months of application.
9. Submission of a written oath that is in accordance with section 20 of the Act.

All documentation for IMT MST admission shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Operations Bureau Chief of IEMA ("Ops Chief"). Admission to the MST is effectuated only upon written notice by the Ops Chief of the approval of the additional member.

#### E. CONTINUING ANNUAL TRAINING and EXERCISE PARTICIPATION

In addition to the prerequisite training, all IMT MST personnel must meet the following training and exercise requirements on an annual basis:

1. Completion of ongoing position-specific professional development training that is approved by the Leader.
2. Participation in three exercises, which may include seminars, workshops, tabletops, games, drills, and functional exercises. Real-world events can count toward this requirement.

In addition, any prerequisite classes required by paragraph D herein that are subsequently updated by FEMA must be retaken by (1) the end of the calendar year following the year of the class revision or (2) the end of the calendar year following the year of team member admission, whichever is later.

Proof of all such training and exercise completion shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Ops Chief. For real-world events or non-IEMA sponsored exercises, the after-action report and an explanation of the team member's involvement in the exercise should be submitted as proof of participation. The failure of a team member to complete the annual training and exercise requirements may result in removal from the IMT MST at the sole discretion of IEMA in consultation with the Leader and Ops Chief.

#### F. TEAM ROSTER

The Leader shall compile an up-to-date team roster including each member's position on an ongoing basis reflecting the current MST membership. The Leader shall submit a copy of the team roster to the Ops Chief no less than semi-annually and criminal background checks annually of all team members.

#### G. DEPLOYMENT

To fall within the scope of this Agreement, the IMT MST must be deployed by the Director or the Ops Chief. The Director or Ops Chief with the concurrence with the Leader will specify to the Leader how many IMT MST team members are



needed for deployment and the specific ICS positions to be filled. This will be in compliance with nationally recognized best practices for IMT. The Leader or his designee shall then be responsible for identifying available team members and providing the names to the Director or Ops Chief for specific assignment. Only team members who are available for a minimum of five consecutive days are eligible for deployment, unless specified otherwise by the Director or Ops Chief.

Personnel and equipment dispatched herein are under the purview of the State until the end of deployment. IMT MST personnel who self-deploy or deploy in response to a request for assistance from any other person or entity are not acting under the purview of the State and thus are not entitled to the liability protections of paragraph H or reimbursement pursuant to paragraph I herein.

#### H. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT AND INJURIES TO PERSONNEL.

Liability for damages to equipment and injuries to personnel dispatched to a disaster pursuant to this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with section 8 of the Act and all other applicable statutes. In addition to other legal requirements, in order for IEMA to assume liability for injuries to personnel engaged in regularly scheduled training or exercises, such training must be approved in writing by the Ops Chief before participation.

#### I. REIMBURSEMENT

Reimbursement for IMT's eligible costs incurred subsequent to deployment pursuant to paragraph H will be made in accordance with IEMA's then-current Reimbursement Policy.

#### J. AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended in writing upon consent of both parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 30 days' written notice served in accordance with paragraph K herein.

**MOBILE SUPPORT TEAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
THE ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY AND  
THE ILLINOIS MEDICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM**

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency ("IEMA") and the Illinois Medical Emergency Response Team ("IMERT") enter into and execute this Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

A. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act ("Act"), 20 ILCS 3305/5, and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. All terminology in the Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Act and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

B. MST DESIGNATION/LEADER/PURPOSE

Pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Director of IEMA ("Director") hereby designates IMERT as a Mobile Support Team ("MST") to lend medical assistance in areas stricken by disaster. The Leader of the IMERT MST ("Leader") is hereby designated on a rotating basis as the current Director of Operations of IMERT. The Leader is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, training, and operation of the IMERT MST under the direction and control of the Director.

C. TERM

This Agreement shall remain in effect from the execution date until terminated in accordance with paragraph J herein.

D. PREREQUISITES FOR TEAM ADMISSION

The following are prerequisites for MST membership for any IMERT team member:

1. Submission of a written application.
2. Completion of the following training:
  - ICS 100, 200 and 700
  - WMD course
  - IMERT Deployment Operations course
3. Submission of documentation indicating successful passage of criminal background check within six months of application or within six months' of execution of this Agreement, whichever is later. Background checks conducted for medical licensing or certification will be deemed to meet this requirement.



4. Submission of a written oath that is in accordance with section 20 of the Act.

All documentation for IMERT MST admission shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Operations Bureau Chief of IEMA ("Ops Chief"). Admission to the MST is effectuated only upon written notice by the Ops Chief of the approval of the additional member.

#### E. CONTINUING ANNUAL TRAINING and EXERCISE PARTICIPATION

In addition to the prerequisite training, all IMERT MST personnel must participate in ongoing training. IMERT MST team members who are currently licensed by the State of Illinois in a medical-related field must participate in two exercises biennially. All other IMERT MST team members must participate in four exercises biennially. Also, any prerequisite classes required by paragraph D herein that are subsequently updated by FEMA must be retaken by (1) the end of the calendar year following the year of the class revision or (2) the end of the calendar year following the year of team member admission, whichever is later.

Proof of all such training and drill completion shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Ops Chief. The failure of a team member to complete the ongoing training requirements may result in removal from the IMERT MST at the discretion of IEMA and the Leader.

#### F. TEAM ROSTER

The Leader shall compile an up-to-date team roster on an ongoing basis reflecting the current MST membership. The Leader shall submit a copy of the team roster to the Ops Chief no less than semi-annually and updated criminal background checks annually of all team members.

#### G. DEPLOYMENT

To fall within the scope of this Agreement, the IMERT MST must be deployed by the Director or the Ops Chief. The Director or Ops Chief, through consultation with the Leader, will provide final approval of the required resources for the mission. The Leader shall then be responsible for identifying available team members and providing the names to the Director or Ops Chief for the specified mission.

Personnel dispatched herein are under the purview of the State until the end of deployment. IMERT MST personnel who self-deploy or deploy in response to a request for assistance from any other person or entity are not acting under the purview of the State and thus are not entitled to the liability protections of paragraph H herein.

#### H. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR INJURIES TO PERSONNEL

Liability for injuries to personnel dispatched to a disaster pursuant to this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with section 8 of the Act and all other applicable statutes and regulations. In addition to other legal requirements, in order for IEMA to assume liability for injuries to personnel engaged in regularly scheduled training or drills, such training must be approved in writing by the Ops Chief before participation.

I. REIMBURSEMENT

IEMA will reimburse IMERT for supplies used during deployment and for expenses incurred by IMERT MST team members during deployment for mileage, lodging and per diem if meals are not otherwise provided.

J. AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended in writing upon consent of both parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 30 days' written notice served in accordance with paragraph K herein.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the Illinois Public Works Mutual Aid Network (IPWMAN), Inc., an Intergovernmental Cooperative, enter into and execute this Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

**A. AUTHORITY**

This agreement is entered into pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act 20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq., and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. This agreement is applicable only to the personnel and assets of the parties who are members of IPWMAN. All terminology in this Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Illinois Emergency Management Act, and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

**B. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide public works disaster response assistance to a unit of local government during declared disasters when local and regional resources are insufficient to meet the disaster response needs of the requesting unit of local government, and to provide for disaster training exercises to maximize the effectiveness of responses to disaster related requests for assistance. Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) requests as approved by IEMA are included as part of this agreement's purpose.

**C. PERFORMANCE PERIOD**

This Agreement shall remain in effect until terminated pursuant to Section I of this Agreement.

**D. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING OR PROVIDING ASSISTANCE DURING A DECLARED DISASTER**

When a disaster is declared to have occurred within the jurisdiction of a local governmental unit by the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the public works resources available through local or regional units are insufficient to adequately respond to the disaster such that the local resources are being utilized to the fullest possible extent, the affected local governmental unit may request assistance from IEMA by contacting the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). All IEMA approved requests for assistance to or from IPWMAN shall be coordinated within the SEOC through the IPWMAN liaison. The SEOC may request assistance from IPWMAN.

Upon receipt of a request for assistance from the SEOC, IPWMAN shall dispatch to the affected area any and all personnel and equipment which is available from the IPWMAN membership.

This Agreement may only be amended upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. The Agreement may be renewed for an additional specific term upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 90 days written notice, as provided in Section J, following.





**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT**  
**STATE OF ILLINOIS**  
**ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY**

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) Illinois enter into and execute this Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

A. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act", 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., and the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act", 20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq., and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. This agreement is applicable only to MABAS assets from local jurisdictions within the boundaries of the State of Illinois. All terminology in this Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

B. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide disaster response assistance to units of local government during declared disasters when local and regional resources are insufficient to meet the disaster response needs of the requesting unit of local government, and to provide for disaster training exercises to maximize the effectiveness of responses to disaster related requests for assistance. Emergency Management Agency Compact (EMAC) requests as approved by IEMA are included as part of this agreements purpose.

C. PERFORMANCE PERIOD

This Agreement shall remain in effect unless terminated pursuant to Section I of this Agreement.

D. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING OR PROVIDING ASSISTANCE DURING A DECLARED DISASTER

When a disaster is declared to have occurred within the jurisdiction of a local governmental unit by the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the resources available through local or regional units are insufficient to adequately respond to the disaster such that the local resources are being utilized to the fullest possible extent, the affected local governmental unit may request assistance from IEMA by contacting the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). All IEMA approved requests for assistance to or from the fire service shall be coordinated within the SEOC through the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) liaison, with the exception of licensed emergency medical transport units under the jurisdiction of the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). The SEOC may request assistance from MABAS as the



exclusive coordinator of Fire, EMS, Haz-Mat, Technical Rescue, Water Rescue/Recovery, USAR, and other associated related resources in Illinois. Upon receipt of a request for assistance from the SEOC, MABAS shall dispatch to the affected area any and all personnel and equipment which are available from the MABAS membership. Personnel and equipment so dispatched shall report to the State Incident Commander at the State Forward Command Post (SFCP), who shall then assign the personnel and equipment to the Local Incident Commander in support of local operations. Upon completion of the disaster response operation, the dispatched personnel and equipment shall be subject to further re-assignment in support of the operation at the discretion of the State Incident Commander. The State Incident Commander may either re-assign the personnel and equipment for additional missions, or provide for the timely release of the personnel and equipment to the sending local governmental units.

#### E. PROCEDURE FOR DISASTER TRAINING EXERCISES

During any training exercises, the procedure set forth in paragraph D, above, shall be followed by the training participants, as required to achieve the objectives of the training exercise. All training exercises will be subject to the mutual agreement and availability of units to participate.

#### F. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT AND INJURIES TO PERSONNEL

Equipment dispatched pursuant to this Agreement shall become property of the State of Illinois while it is being used pursuant to this Agreement. Personnel dispatched pursuant to this agreement shall be members of Mobile Support Teams, as provided in Section 8 of the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/8) during their service pursuant to this Agreement. Liability for damages to equipment and/or injuries to personnel shall be determined pursuant to relevant provisions of the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq.) and all other applicable statutes.

#### G. REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COST OF RESPONSE

Responding agencies acting pursuant to this Agreement shall be reimbursed for all eligible costs incurred for responses approved by IEMA pursuant to this Agreement and in accordance with the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq.) and other applicable statutes. Eligible costs are those incurred on or after the date of a disaster event that is the subject of a State disaster declaration. Except for costs covered under Section F of this Agreement, responding agencies may be reimbursed, in whole or in part, for those costs incurred prior to receiving IEMA's approval. Such determination shall be at the sole discretion of IEMA in accordance with statutory authority.

#### H. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Director of IEMA may, at his or her discretion, appoint an Advisory Committee to assist in the implementation and refinement of this Agreement. The membership of such

committee shall include a minimum of one (1) MABAS representative.

I. AMENDMENTS, RENEWAL, AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon written notice, as provided in Section J, following.

# ILLINOIS RACES PLAN

Revised 04 FEB 2010

This document outlines a Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) program for the State of Illinois.

## IEMA

The Director of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency will appoint a qualified individual to serve as the volunteer **State RACES Officer (SRO)**. This individual will serve as the single point of contact between IEMA and the Illinois amateur radio community.

IEMA will provide an equipped, operational RACES station. This State RACES station will be provided with sufficient communications equipment and resources such that it can maintain wired or wireless communications with the State EOC.

## SRO

- ❑ The **SRO** will appoint two volunteer **Deputy State RACES Officer (DSRO)** to ensure continuity of command and control in the event of unavailability of the **SRO**.
- ❑ The **SRO** will identify and appoint six qualified amateur radio operators to staff the State RACES station as communicators when RACES has been activated for an emergency or exercise event. Three of these individuals will be considered Primary operators and three will be considered as secondary or alternate operators.
- ❑ The **SRO** will appoint eight volunteer **Regional RACES Officers (RRO)**, one for each of the IEMA Regions.
- ❑ The **SRO** will appoint two **Deputy RRO's (DRRO)** for each IEMA Region to ensure command and control continuity.
- ❑ The **SRO** will establish suitable training criteria for **RRO's, DRRO's** and State RACES station operators. Additionally, the **SRO** will make recommendations to county/city emergency managers regarding suitable training courses for all enrolled volunteer Illinois RACES operators.
- ❑ The **SRO** will develop and distribute a State RACES Plan detailing RACES operations and logistics.
- ❑ The **SRO's** point of contact at IEMA will be the Communications Officer.

## RRO's

Each **RRO** will

- ❑ provide emergency or exercise amateur radio communications assistance to the IEMA Region Coordinator as needed
- ❑ serve as the amateur radio point of contact between the IEMA Region Coordinator and the county RACES programs in that region

- work with local emergency managers to recruit and train suitable County/City RACES Officers (**CRO**)

### **CRO's**

In each Illinois county (or city, in the case of those communities providing their own emergency management agencies), the emergency manager wishing to participate in the Illinois RACES program shall be responsible to identify and appoint a suitably trained amateur radio operator holding a valid General or higher class FCC-issued amateur radio license, as the County (or city) RACES Officer (**CRO**).

The **CRO** will

- provide RACES communications services in times of emergency or drills to his/her county/city emergency management agency
- be responsible to enroll and manage volunteer amateur radio operators in the county RACES organization in accordance with the credentialing and membership requirements of the respective county/city emergency management agency.

### **RACES Activation**

- The State RACES station will be activated only by the Director of IEMA or his designee.
- Region RACES stations will be activated only by the Director of IEMA or his designee.
- County/city RACES groups will be activated only by the responsible county/city emergency manager.

***Under no circumstances will RACES stations self-activate.***

RACES reporting chain:

County/city RACES members communicate with **CRO's**  
**CRO's** communicate with their **RRO** and other **CRO's**, as the situation demands  
**RRO's** communicate with the State RACES station.

### **Credentials**


The **SRO**, **DSRO**, and **RRO's** will be provided with suitable credentials by IEMA. **CRO's** and RACES members will be provided suitable credentials by their respective emergency management agency.

### **Emergency Communications Exercises**


The **SRO** will provide the schedule and details of regular emergency communications exercises designed to ensure that all RACES operators have adequate experience and training to perform back-up communications in the event of an emergency.

## RACES/ARES® Cooperative Effort

The Amateur Radio Emergency Service® is a program of the American Radio Relay League and consists of amateur radio operators who have volunteered their time, talents, and equipment to provide emergency communications when needed. Dual membership, i.e., ARES® and RACES, for all enrolled RACES operators at all levels is strongly encouraged. The **SRO** will work closely with the ARES Section Emergency Coordinator to best provide emergency communications at local, regional and state levels. In all cases, however, amateur radio communications with IEMA, whether it originates with ARES or RACES members, shall be directed through the Illinois RACES program.

**MOBILE SUPPORT TEAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN

The prior agreement entitled "Memorandum of Understanding" between IEMA and IESMA dated July 17, 2004, is terminated.

C. MST DESIGNATION/LEADER/PURPOSE

Pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Director of IEMA ("Director") hereby creates an IESMA-sponsored Mobile Support Team ("MST") to aid and to reinforce IEMA and emergency services and disaster agencies in areas stricken by disaster. The team shall be comprised of members of the Emergency Management Assistance Team ("EMAT"). The Leader of the EMAT MST ("Leader") is hereby designated on a rotating basis as the current President of IESMA. The Leader is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, training, and operation of the EMAT MST under the direction and control of the Director. The purpose of the team is to supplement personnel in emergency operations centers at the State and local levels.

D. TERM

This Agreement shall remain in effect from the execution date until terminated in accordance with paragraph K herein.

E. PREREQUISITES FOR TEAM ADMISSION

The following are prerequisites for MST membership for any EMAT member:

1. Submission of a written application.
2. Completion of the following training:

- NIMS and ICS Courses, and IEMA Professional Development Series as outlined in the IEMA Operations Training and Exercise SOG.
3. Minimum of 3 years' experience in emergency management.
  4. Submission of documentation indicating successful passage of criminal background check within 6 months of application.
  5. Submission of a written oath that is in accordance with section 20 of the Act.

All documentation for EMAT MST admission shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Operations Bureau Chief of IEMA ("Ops Chief"). Admission to the MST is effectuated only upon written notice by the Ops Chief of the approval of the additional member.

#### F. CONTINUING ANNUAL TRAINING and EXERCISE PARTICIPATION

In addition to the prerequisite training, all EMAT MST personnel must meet the following training and exercise requirements on an annual basis:

1. Completion of 24 hours of emergency management professional development training that is approved by the Leader.
2. Participation in three exercises, which may include seminars, workshops, tabletops, games, drills, and functional exercises. Real-world events can count toward this requirement.

In addition, any prerequisite classes required by paragraph E herein that are subsequently updated by FEMA must be retaken by (1) the end of the calendar year following the year of the class revision or (2) the end of the calendar year following the year of team member admission, whichever is later.

Proof of all such training and exercise completion shall first be screened for compliance by the Leader and then be submitted to the Ops Chief. For real-world events or non-IEMA sponsored exercises, the after-action report and an explanation of the team member's involvement in the exercise should be submitted as proof of participation. The failure of a team member to complete the annual training and exercise requirements may result in removal from the EMAT MST at the sole discretion of IEMA.

#### G. TEAM ROSTER

EMAT MST personnel who self-deploy or deploy in response to a request for assistance from any other person or entity are not acting under the purview of the State and thus are not entitled to the liability protections of paragraph I or reimbursement pursuant to paragraph J herein.

I. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT AND INJURIES TO PERSONNEL.

Liability for damages to equipment and injuries to personnel dispatched to a disaster pursuant to this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with section 8 of the Act and all other applicable statutes. In addition to other legal requirements, in order for IEMA to assume liability for injuries to personnel engaged in regularly scheduled training or exercises, such training must be approved in writing by the Ops Chief before participation.

J. REIMBURSEMENT

Reimbursement for EMAT's eligible costs incurred subsequent to deployment pursuant to paragraph H will be made in accordance with IEMA's then-current Reimbursement Policy.

K. AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended in writing upon consent of both parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 30 days' written notice served in accordance with paragraph L herein.

L. NOTICES

All notices required under this Agreement shall be served personally or by certified or registered mail to the other party as set forth below.


